

Earliest Age for Vaccine	Immunization	Notes
At birth	Hepatitis B Vaccine	<p>Funded by OHIP in grade 7 but can be given earlier.</p> <p>Appears to be no decrease in protective effect if given at early age. Schedule is 0, 1, 6 months. Less immunogenicity reported if baby is < 2000 grams.</p>
2 months	<p>Group B Meningitis Vaccine</p> <p>Bexsero</p> <p>Group C Meningitis Vaccines</p>	<p>As of Dec 2016, still not funded by OHIP.</p> <p>For infants 2-5 months, 4 doses should be given at 2, 4, and 6 months followed by a booster at 12-23 months.</p> <p>For infants 6-11 months, 3 doses should be given with at least 2 months separating them – third dose should be given in the second year of life. For infants 12-23 months, only 2 doses are required at least 2 months apart. For children 2-10, 2 doses must be given at least 2 months apart. For children 11-17, 2 doses should be given at least 1 month apart.</p> <p>Funded by OHIP starting at 12 months and given again in schools during the grade 7 year. See next page for various Meningitis C vaccines available.</p> <p>For infants 2-12 months 3 doses at least 1 month</p>

	<p>Menjugate</p> <p>NeisVac-C</p> <p>Group ACYW135 Meningitis Vaccines</p>	<p>apart followed by a booster dose (usually after 12 months). Infants 12 months and over need only a single dose (it is funded by OHIP at 12 months).</p> <p>If less than 4 months, baby receives 2 doses (0.5 ml) at least 2 months apart. Second dose must happen after baby is 5 months or older. If baby is 4 months or older, they can receive 1 dose only (0.5 ml).</p> <p>Schedules exist for these vaccines starting at 2 months but they are not recommended by NACI for healthy children. If the child is high risk Menveo is the preferred ACYW135 vaccine at 2-23 months.</p>
9 Years	HPV Vaccines (Gardasil, Gardasil 9, Cervarix)	<p>Vaccine is not OHIP-covered until grade 8.</p> <p>Indicated for boys and girls ages 9-45 and boys ages 9-26. Safety and efficacy data not available outside of these ages.</p>
